Students move from learning concepts to using them in unfamiliar settings.



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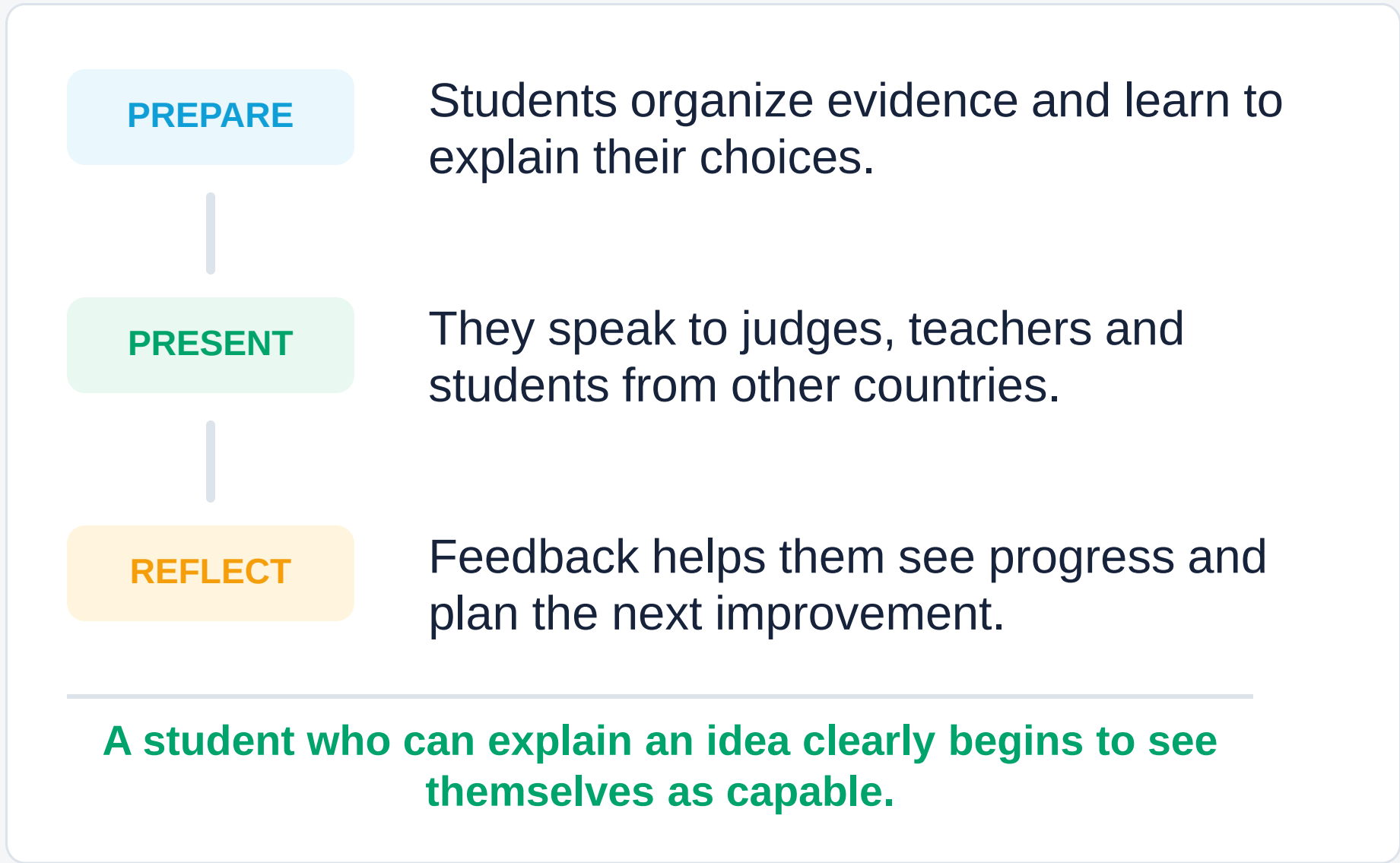
Classroom foundation

They return with stronger motivation, wider networks and examples for other students.

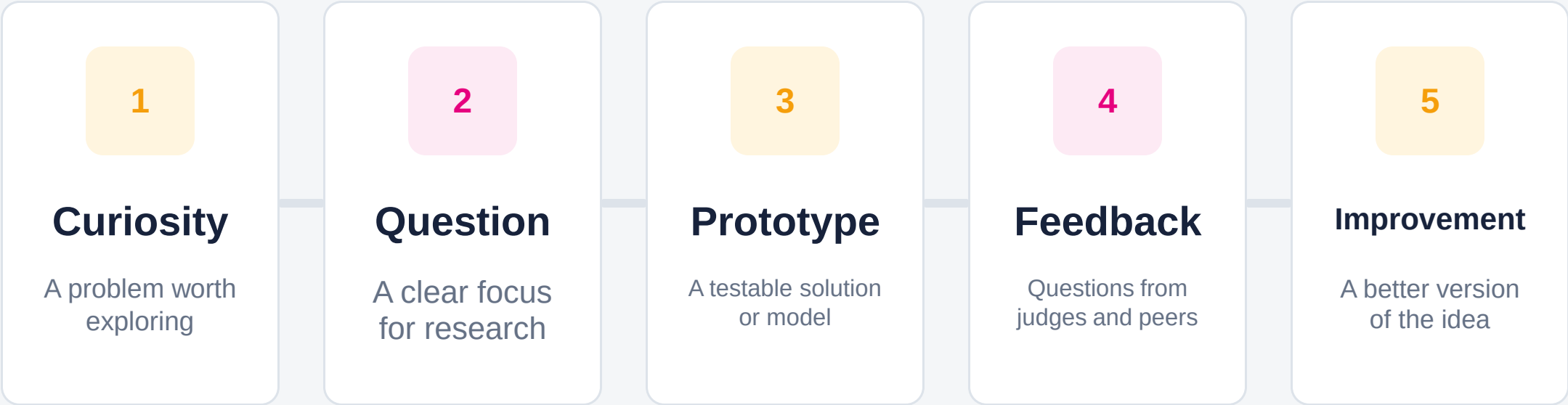
Public presentation builds confidence

Cross-cultural teams strengthen ideas

Different experiences encourage students to listen, adapt and explain their thinking.



LISTEN

Students learn that one problem can have different local meanings.

EXPLAIN

They make assumptions clear and communicate without relying on familiar context.

ADAPT

New perspectives help teams revise ideas and make solutions more useful.

RESPECT

Shared work turns cultural difference into understanding and friendship.

Competition turns effort into discipline

Clear standards help students manage time, evidence and responsibility.

DEADLINE

Plans become schedules, and students learn to finish work.

CRITERIA

Rubrics show what quality means and where improvement is needed.

EVIDENCE

Claims need research, testing or a clear business case.

QUESTIONS

Students defend decisions and acknowledge limits honestly.
